## **WASTE AUDIT RESULTS**

Room 4 conducted a waste audit of our recyclable (organic) and non-recyclable waste over a week at our school. We found:

- 2.4kg of fruit and vegetable scraps
- 100g of whole fruit
- 3kg of paper and cardboard
- 12 items of chip packets (salty/savoury wrappers)
- 23 pieces of lolly and ice cream wrappers
- 25 pieces of plastic bags and cling wrap
- 2 unopened whole packaged food items.

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## **ARE YOU CONNECTED?**

Our Staff and School Board members really encourage all parents to ensure they regularly check in with Connect.

Connect is our primary way we keep in touch with families. Connect provides a secure and convenient way to keep in touch with your child's education anytime, anywhere on any device.

#### **Use Connect to:**

- Access your child's reports.
- Communicate easily with teachers.
- Stay informed about school activities.

Our school will provide you with a secure user name and a password.

#### Login to Connect at:

www.connect.det.wa.edu.au

#### Can't remember your login details?

We will provide you with a **user name** (Pnumber) and **password** to login to Connect. If your children attend multiple schools, you will still only need one login. If you can't remember your login details or need to reset your password you can do so by clicking the 'Forgot Password' on the login screen at connect.det.wa.edu.au. If you have received multiple logins or there is an issue with your login, you should contact your child's school so that they can investigate the situation for you.



#### Locked account? How do you unlock it?

Your account may become locked if you attempt to log in too many times with an incorrect password. If your account is locked you will need to contact your child's school so they can unlock it.

#### Can't find your child's report in Connect?

Schools choose whether they will publish student reports in Connect. Once published, parents and students can find the reports in the My Children tab of Connect in the section called Reports. You will only see the Reports section if there are published reports for your child. Once published to Connect, reports will remain available until your child leaves the public education system. To see previous years' reports, select the Year from the right-hand menu. If you can't see a report but believe that you should be able to, contact your child's school so they can investigate the issue for you.

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## **REPORTING TO PARENTS**

With the regular attendance of many students being lower over Semester 1 2020, the breadth and depth of the curriculum taught and assessed has been reduced in some areas. This will impact on what can be reported at the end of the semester.

Schools are not required to include A to E grades on the Semester 1 student reports. Members of the Teaching Staff and the School Board have agreed that this is reasonable, and have also recently made the following decisions regarding reporting for Semester 1 2020.

- Written comments will be provided for English, Maths and the General Comments.
   Comments may provide less information about progress than would usually be expected. Effort will also be reported.
- Achievement as A to E grades will not be reported for any Learning Areas. This means there will not be any position reports available.
- All other Learning Areas taught will report effort.
- Overall Attitude, Behaviour and effort at the end of the report will also be rated as is usually the case.
- Attendance will be reported with a comment also noting the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic this semester on attendance.

Reports will be distributed through Connect on Friday 3 July, the last day of term. This provides class teachers with the longest timeframe for monitoring student learning and progress.
