Wouldn't it be great if parents really only needed to know 10 Things to raise children successfully? When they're babies, it's usually pretty simple. Feed them. Change them. Put them to sleep. Then they start growing. Fast. They talk. They get moody. They have "needs". They get siblings and start fighting, biting, pinching, punching, scratching, and more. They start school and come home with nasty words, threats that "you're not my best friend anymore", and all-too-often, even more challenging behaviour. Even when they're a dream, we still worry about how we can give them the best start in life.

So what are the ten things parents need to know?

- We do best as parents when we parent together on the same page
- Our kids thrive when they know they matter

- Being understood is often a child's greatest need
- For discipline, kids need something better than punishment
- · We need to teach them to get along
- They need opportunities and time to work out who they are
- Parents understand and balance access to technology
- We need to protect our children's childhood
- Find the joy for them, for us, for family

Ten Things Every Parent Needs to Know is ultimately about this final idea: finding joy. Finding joy in family life is the key.

These ideas are a surefire way to put us, our kids, and our families on the pathway to regular injections of joy at home.
