- Land Art is a movement that started back in the 1960s
- In 1970 Robert Smithson created Smithson's Spiral Jetty in the Great Salt Lake, Utah. It is only visible when the tide is low
- Land Art uses natural materials, rocks, sticks, sand, leaves, water, and even concrete, metal and minerals
- The two most common types of sand are silica (silicon dioxide) and quartz (silica with impurities)
- The most common species of tree in the south west are jarrah, karri and marri

Parent Survey Results: Planning 2018-2020 What really mattered to you ...

At the end of last term, a parent/ family survey was sent out called What Really Matters to You. Twelve families returned their forms representing 21 children out of a possible 52. (some families were away when the survey was conducted). This gave us a return rate that represents 40% of all children.

What did we find out?

Parents really endorsed that Karridale Primary School provides and will continue to provide their children with:

- A safe, friendly, loving and nurturing learning environment;
- Plenty of outside excursions and amazing extra-curricular activities including camps;
- Small class sizes with intense oneon-one support for children who need it;
- Lots of play in early childhood area and lots of outside time for everyone;
- The basics are covered to a good standard (reading, writing, maths);
- Great opportunities to gain new

skills in life;

- A country school personable environment with a focus on social and moral values creating a sense of belongingness;
- Up to date teaching programs delivered by role model teachers and support staff dedicated to evolving to the changing needs of the whole school community;
- Children transition well to high school socially and academically. The Year 5/6 music program also supports the secondary school music program if desired.
- Environmental education, creative arts classes, sports, team mateship activities, buddies program and behaviour management are seen as strengths;
- There is confidence in the leadership from the very beginning of starting at KPS;
- Student councillors leadership roles are important.

Some suggestions for the future were:

• Introduce a science fair and more

hands-on experiments;

- Get to know children from other schools through visiting/inviting visitors for lessons;
- More charity involvement and fundraising showing support of others;
- More interesting playground items.

Thank you to the families who participated in the survey and shared their thoughts and thanks. The staff have considered all of your responses at their staff meetings, and the School Board have the survey on their next agenda.
