Year 3-6 children thrive

During this term, we have been investigating how the Year 3-6 children are experiencing the learning environment and relationships at our school. To do this we use three student surveys that focus on: 1. Their 'connectedness' to school—to their class, their learning and the staff.

2. Their experiences of conflict, how they resolve conflict, if it's a problem for

them and who they have as support. 3. Their mindset—are they open to learning and willing to grow, or is a fixed mindset holding them back.

We are able to see individual and class results and compare these to last year and trends. I am very happy to be able to let you know that: 1. All children feel comfortable and safe in their class and are connected to their learning. Continued on page 2

Children in Year 5 will be completing the writing trial on Monday 20 August and Years 3 & 5 will do a mixed assessment on Tuesday 21 August.

Shire Recycling Update -what can & can't be binned

The Shire has updated its Waste and Recycling Guidelines, which are not reflected in the recently issued Rates Notice information. State-wide changes to the waste market have meant a revised list of items that can be placed in all Shire recycling bins. The changes are the result of trying to reduce contamination in the recycling bins, and get back to

Outdoor learning helps you to grow smarter!

Research shows outdoor learning helps to improve problem solving abilities, emotional intelligence important education outcomes, according to a Planet Ark report. The report, 'Learning from trees: life lessons for future generations', explores the skills and attributes children need to deal with future challenges. Students in Finland, who perform highest on international benchmarks, spend at least 15

minutes in every hour of the school day outdoors. At Karridale PS, in addition to our scheduled break times and two hours of timetable physical activity, we use outdoors for learning wherever possible. Most recently all classes completed their "Birds of a Feather" Land Art project and classes have been planting and watching their seeds and seedlings grow.

Why is skin cancer so common in Australia?

Australia has the second highest rates of skin cancer in the world, having recently been overtaken by New Zealand. Skin cancer is Australia's most common cancer, with data showing that skin cancers account for around 80% of all newly diagnosed cancers.

The main cause of skin cancer is sunburn and tanning, or exposure to UV radiation, made worse in Australia by out location and skin types. The solutions? Check the UV

Index www.myuv.com.au, or by using the SunSmart app. When it's 3 or above, use sun protection.

The sun's UV radiation is also our best source of vitamin D, however, wearing sensible sun protection has been shown to have little effect on vitamin D levels, whereas the risk of skin cancer in Australia is proven. Schools are advised to enforce the wearing of sun protective hats (not caps) during outdoor activities when the UV index is 3 or above. (Cancer Council WA)
