Outdoor Classroom Day

Karridale Primary School have registered to be part of the 2018 global campaign, aiming to get as many children as possible playing and learning outside on Thursday 1 November.

The whole school will be meeting at 9am at the new "Bird's Nest" outdoor classroom. The Year 5/6 class will launch the day introduce Indigenous Trail in the bush area at the corner of Bussell Hwy and Chapman Road. This project commenced two years ago when Josh Whiteland kindly shared knowledge of indigenous plants in our bushland, and told us about their uses and importance to the Wadandi people. Students wanted to share this information not only with the school, but beyond, and have created handouts



about the plants. The Year 5/6 students will pair up and work with groups of students for a 40 minute journey around the trail talking about the indigenous plants. Parents are most welcome to join in

During the day, classes will have their own activities outside, which will include capturing images of significant 'things' they see outdoors. Each child will choose

their favourite photo, and this will be incorporated into a slideshow to be produced by the Year 5/6 students. The slideshow will be presented to the whole school in the Undercover Area at 2.45pm. Parents and friends are welcome to join the screening.

SkoolBag App Update—do you have SkoolBag V3?

The latest update of SkoolBag requires users to register for an account. Your SkoolBag account enables you to keep your SkoolBag information in sync across multiple devices. It also enables you to subscribe to specific groups that your school has

set up. You only need to register once—you can then log in with the same username and password across all of your devices. Updates should have happened automatically. If yours didn't, there is help on the SkoolBag website.


Responsibility
